#### CHURCH NEWS

The proceeds of these two events are shared between the church and Care after Combat. Care after Combat is an organisation which cares for veterans who have had a tough time and ended up in prison. "Goose" (Gary Cryer) is a local Christian who visits these veterans. So please turn out your unwanted items for the White Horse, get them to Sharon and Joan and also support the coffee morning, if you can.

These events also support the church. Financially, the church in South Holderness is struggling to pay for four members of the clergy throughout the deanery. (thirty years ago we had eleven) If you have ever wondered about the usefulness of the existence of C of E clergy in an age of religious apathy, talk to someone who has had a family member commit suicide or had to bury a stillborn baby- as this is where they earn their keep... at the centre of family heartbreak in the community.

The evening prayer tea parties are a light hearted attempt to encourage people into church who feel that structured and organised religion is not necessarily for them. They are mainly sociable. There will be one on October 23rd and one on November 6th. They take place at 4 pm in the chancel. On 16th October and 27th November we have a communion service with Rev Alisdair at 9.30am. On 13th November our Remembrance Sunday commemoration begins in church at 10 am and then proceeds to the war memorial for 11am. If you feel strongly about this event, and wish to help contribute by leading a prayer, doing a bible reading or reciting a poem, please get in touch with us.
