SPURN BIRD OBSERVATORY

Beacon Lagoons Little Tern Colony update.

This season, we have had a minimum of 58 Little Terns sitting on nests making it one of the best years since the turn of the century. In turn, we have been seeing incredible numbers of youngsters since the later part of June with a minimum of 80 being seen in single scans of the colony. At least 25 have fledged so far too, with many more almost ready to do so this week. There are however just a couple of nests with small young so the season is far from over yet. We have also got six pairs of Avocet, seven pairs of Oystercatcher and twelve pairs of Ringed Plover. We have also been completing some colony walk throughs to ring some of the chicks, we have ringed over 50 this season and put Darvic colour rings on seven making them easier to identify in the field. There have been some interesting adult Little Terns at the colony with Darvic rings from elsewhere, with one from Ireland in 2019 and another that was metal ringed at the Beacon Ponds colony in 2015 but had its

All in all, we hope to continue having a very successful season - maybe even have somewhere near 100 chicks fledge!

We would like to thank the local community for your
